1	Will the EOI be used as a final method of selecting Lead Managers or is there a potential for further rounds?	Please note that this publication is an EOI which seeks to shortlist firms for the next stage of the selection process. The procurement process being used is different from the previous process where firms are shortlisted to provide proposals. This time round, there is a published EOI for all potential firms to apply for shortlisting unto the next stage.
2	The EOI does not request fees explicitly, are fees required at this stage?	Applicants are expected to respond to the stated questions on the EOI of which fees are not included.
3	Can Lead Managers jointly bid with other parties or are you expecting sole bids?	The EOI did not make provision for consortium, thus the Ministry does not encourage joint bids to be submitted.
4	Do you require to receive the four hard copies in Accra by 17:00 GMT 25th January, or is the electronic submission of the soft copies on the 25th satisfactory, with the hard copies reaching you in Accra in the following days?	The Ministry requires that the four hard copies and the electronic version will all be received by 17:00 GMT on 25th January, 2019.
