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# THIRD QUARTERLY REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE CENTRAL TENDER REVIEW COMMITTEE

The report of the Central Tender Review Committee (CTRC) covering the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of FY2023, which is being presented for information. The activities of the Committee are derived from the Public Procurement Act 2003 (Act 663) and the Amendment Act, Act 914.

- 2. The CTRC is the highest Review Committee under the referenced Acts. The Committee operates under the direct supervision of the Minister for Finance. The Committee has nine (9) members, including a Secretary and a Chairman.
- 3. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, 161 evaluation report submissions were received from procurement entities for review. The evaluation reports comprised Works, 33 (55%) with a value of GHC1.4 billion (49%), Goods, 95 (37%) with a value of GHC954.0 million and Services, 33 (8%) amounted to GHC252.0 million.

Fifty-One (51) out of the total submissions, representing 31.68%, were granted concurrent approvals while Ninety-Seven (97) reports representing 60.25% are awaiting clarifications and responses to queries from respective entities. Approval was granted to twelve (12) reports (7.45%) to proceed to the next stage of the procurement process whereas one (1) report representing (0.62%) was not granted approval.

- 4. Approval of award amount in total made within the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of FY2023 was GHC1.6 Billion (this includes evaluation reports from previous quarters approved within the quarter under review).
- 5. Please accept the assurances of my highest esteem and best regards.

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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

Established under Section 20 of the Public Procurement Act, 2003 (Act 663), the Central Tender Review Board (CTRB), now the Central Tender Review Committee (CTRC) is mandated to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Public Procurement Act by Procurement Entities. The Committee is supported by a Secretariat at the Ministry of Finance.

During the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2023, total value of various procurement request submissions received amounted to **GH¢2.5 billion**. Out of this value, Works amounted to **GH¢1.4 billion** (55%), Goods recorded 37% with a value of **GH¢953.0 million** while Services amounted to **GH¢203.0 million** (8%).

The Committee received **161** evaluation reports from procurement entities. The evaluation reports comprised **Works**, **33** (**20.50%**), **Goods**, **95** (**59.00%**), and **Services**, **33** (**20.50%**). Fifty-one (**51**) out of the total submissions, representing **31.68%** were granted outright concurrent approvals while Nine-seven (**97**) reports representing **60.25%** had issues raised by the Committee for redress by the procurement entities. Approval was granted to twelve (**12**) Technical Evaluation Reports (**7.45%**) to proceed to the next stage of the procurement process.

Submissions (including emergency submissions) approved over the period amounted to **GH¢309.0 million** out of the total of **GH¢2.5 billion** submissions, while the total submissions from previous quarters given concurrent approval within same period amounted to **GH¢1.3 billion**. Overall, a total of **GH¢1.6 billion** was approved within this quarter (July-September 2023). Tables 1a and 1b below present the distribution of approvals in value relative to procurement types and inter-sectoral procurement expenditure respectively. Fifty-One (51) reports were approved totalling **GH¢307,056,894.51** in the quarter. Out of the Fifty-One reports approved, **38** were of Goods, **10** were of Services and **3** for Works. In Sectorial, 13 reports were approved from the Administrative sector, 15 from the Economic, 2 from the Infrastructure, 3 from Public Safety and 18 from the Social Sector.

Tables 1.1 and 1.2 above are the representation of all the submissions received from the various entities during the period under review. The submissions are classified into the various types of procurements (Goods, Services and Works). During the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) quarter of 2023, the Committee reviewed a total of One Hundred and Sixty-One (161) evaluation reports in its regular and emergency sittings. Of this total, procurement of Goods (Supplies) totalling Ninety-Five (95) and represented 59.00% of the total evaluation reports were reviewed within the period. Procurement of Works totalled Thirty-Three (33) represented 20.50% and the procurement of Services totalled Thirty-Three (33) and represented 20.50% of the total submissions reviewed within the period.




Figure 1.1 Submission by Procurement Type

As submitted in Figure 1.1, August recorded the least submission of evaluation reports, with 43 submissions (26.54%) for review. Thirty-One (31) submissions were reviewed during regular sittings of the Committee and represented 22.63% while the remaining Eleven (11) were submitted for emergency sittings and represented 45.83%. July recorded a total of 54 submissions (33.33%). Forty-Seven (47) submissions were reviewed during regular sittings of the Committee and represented 34.31% while the remaining Seven (7) were submitted for emergency sittings and represented 29.17%. September recorded the highest submissions of evaluation reports (40.12%) for review in a single month. Fifty-Nine (59) submissions were reviewed during regular sitting of the Committee and represented 43.07% while the remaining six (6) were submitted for emergency sittings and represented 25%. The performance of September in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of the year can be attributed to a period when MDAs were certain about the budgetary allocations and the build-up of their Internally Generated Funds (IGFs) that can be allocated for procurement of works, goods or services.




Figure 1.2 Submission by Procurement Method

Table 1.3 and Figure 1.2 summarize the submissions in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2023 by procurement methods. Figure 1.2 shows that, the method with the highest frequency during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter was the National Competitive Tendering (NCT) (57.76%), followed by Restrictive Tendering (RT) (16.77%), Expression of Interest/Request for Proposal/Quality and Cost Based Selection (RFP/EOI/QCBS) (10.56%), Variation/Addendum (8.7%), Direct Selection (DS) (1.86%), International Competitive Tendering (ICT) (1.86%), Request for Quotation (RFQ), Shopping (SS) and Pre-Qualification (PRE-Q) took up 0.62% each. The above distribution by method of procurement is useful in understanding the procurement practices dominant in among the entities. These trends aid decision making since procurement methods depict the tendencies and preferences of certain entities.




Figure 1.3 Submission by Sector of Procurement

Figure 1.3 summarizes the procurement submissions in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2023 by Sectors. One Hundred and Sixty-One (161) evaluation reports submitted various procurements for approval consideration. Forty-One (41) from the Administrative, Forty-Four (44) from the Economic, Thirteen (13) from the infrastructure, fifty-nine (59) from the Social and four (5) from the Public Safety Sectors. From the Figure 1.3 above, the sector with the highest procurements is the Social Sector (59).

At the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, 25.47% of the reviewed submissions were from the Administrative Sector, 27.33% were from the Economic Sector, 8.07% from the Infrastructure Sector, 36.65% from the Social Sector and 2.48% from the Public Safety Sector. The distribution above suggests that the Social Sector has lots of individual procurement activities and receives a significant amount of attention in the review process. Among the other sectors, the Public Safety Sector had the least submissions.

Out of the One Hundred and Sixty-one (161) evaluation reports received during the period, thirty-eight (38) evaluation reports submitted under Goods were approved, fifty-four (54) received under Goods had issues to address and/or clarify and hence not approved. Out of the thirty-three (33) evaluation reports submitted under Services, ten (10) were granted outright concurrent approval while the other thirteen (13) had issues to address and/or clarify. Also, the approved evaluation reports under Works totalled three (3) and thirty (30) had issues to address and/or clarify.

The distribution discussed above suggests that there were a significant number of evaluation reports that had issues to address and/or clarify across all procurement types, particularly in the Goods and Works categories. This may indicate a need for more rigorous evaluation processes and improved performance in the evaluation of Goods and Works procurement among the entities. On the other hand, it is encouraging to see that a significant number of evaluation reports received outright approval, particularly in the Services category.




Figure 1.5 Status of Approval by Procurement Type

In conclusion, fifty-one (51) of the evaluation reports, representing 32.68% received outright approvals. On the contrary, ninety-seven (97) of the reviewed evaluation reports, representing 60.25% had issues that needed to be addressed and/or clarified. Upon review, twelve (12) evaluation reports representing 7.45% were granted approval to proceed to the next stage of the procurement process and the Committee was unable to grant approval for one (1) evaluation report representing 0.62%.




Figure 1.6 Value of Concurrent Approvals per Meetings in GH¢mln.

From Figure 1.6, One Billion, Three Hundred and Eighty-Eight Million, Nine Hundred and Fifty-One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five Ghana Cedis and Seventy-Nine Pesewas (GH¢1,388,951,975.79) was the value of procurement from the previous quarter (2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, 2023) given concurrent approval in the quarter under review. These were procurement activities that the Committee raised issues but which the entities have successfully addressed in the current under review. The least amount of Nine Million, One Hundred and Forty Thousand, Fifty-Seven Ghana Cedis and Twenty-Five Pesewas (GH¢9,140,057.25) was approved during 38<sup>th</sup> Sittings during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter. Two Hundred and Eighty-Eight Million, Six Hundred and Thirteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty-Five Ghana Cedis and Thirty-One Pesewas (GH¢288,613,835.31) were from the Regular Sittings.

At the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter, approved amount from responses in previous quarters made up of about 81.77% while 17.15% and 1.09% were from regular and emergency sittings, respectively. The Two Hundred and Thirty-Seven (237) procurement submissions that were approved during the regular sittings, emergency sittings as well as responses from previous quarters of year 2023 amounted to GH¢1.69 billion. The difference between the GH¢1.38 billion and GH¢1.69 billion were the result of the satisfactory evaluation reports of one hundred and sixty-one (161) new evaluation reports during the regular sittings and seventy-six (76) responses to queries that were denied approvals in the previous quarter of year 2023.




Figure 1.7 Total Value of all Submissions in Percentages SOURCE: CTRC DATA, 2023

From Figure 1.7, the total procurement made under all the types of procurement during the quarter under review amounted to  $GH\cupeche$ 2.5 billion. With Services amounting to  $GH\cupeche$ 203.0 million and representing 8%, Goods recorded 37% with a value of  $GH\cupeche$ 953.0 million and Works amounted to  $GH\cupeche$ 1.40 billion (55%).




Figure 1.8 Approved Amount of Procurement Type in Percentages **SOURCE: CTRC DATA, 2023** 

From Figure 1.8, it is clear that, goods at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter amounted to GH¢230,365,016.70 representing 74% whereas Services amounted to GH¢67,117,686.78 representing 22%, and Works amounted to GH¢12,264,189.74 representing 4% of all reviewed evaluation reports during the period.




Figure 1.9 Number of Queried Submissions in Percentages SOURCE: CTRC DATA, 2023

It is notable that the queried evaluation reports had issues to be clarified and/or to be addressed by procurement entities. Deducing from Figure 1.9, the highest value of queried evaluated reports was cited for Works at GH(1393,603,843.49 million (62%), followed by Goods at GH(136,740,501.11 million (6%).

This evidence suggests that some of the evaluation reports submitted by procurement entities for Works, Goods, and Services had issues. The highest value of queried evaluation reports was for works, followed by goods and services. The distribution suggests that there may be significant challenges with the procurement processes for works, and it may be worth investigating these issues further especially with project variations (addendum). On the other hand, the situation may be due to a failure or a reluctance to learn from the queries that eventually delays the procurement processes for entities.

#### 3.0 ISSUES AND OBSERVATIONS RAISED BY THE CTRC

The common issues and observations frequently raised by the CTRC for further clarification and/or redress by the procurement entities are in three categories; technical, financial and documentation as presented below:

#### **Technical**

- Tender validity period being expired.
- No justified grounds for disqualification of tenders.
- No basis provided for the establishment of price adjustment by the Entity.
- No remarks made on the basis for acceptance of specifications that fall short of strict compliance to minimum specification indicated/stated in tender documents.
- Minutes of tender opening not signed.
- Evaluation report not signed by tender evaluation panel members.

#### **Financial**

- No price reasonableness analysis carried out to confirm market price competitiveness of single responsive offers.
- No clarity provided on the basis for adjustment of read-out prices resulting in lower amounts of award recommendation.
- No information was provided on sources and availability of funding for variation works.
- No source reference of market prices for purchase options as well as cost benefit analysis.
- No price reasonable analysis done to justify market price competitiveness of recommended award amount.

#### **Documentation**

- No documentary evidence provided for the disqualification of tenderers.
- No documentary evidence provided on originally signed tender opening records to authenticate the offer prices used for the evaluation of tenders.

- No documentary evidence on advertisement of tenders attached to evaluation reports.
- No information provided on the Evaluation of Expression of Interest from which the most qualified firm is selected for proposal submission.
- Inconsistencies with read out prices recorded on different pages of evaluation reports.
- No documentary evidence of availability of funding.
- No minutes of Negotiation Meetings attached to evaluation reports.
