STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENTS TO SOLICIT INPUTS INTO THE 2023 NATIONAL BUDGET

Government through the Ministry of Finance organized a 2-day stakeholder meeting to solicit for inputs for consideration into the 2023 Budget Statement and Economic Policy to be presented by Finance Minister, Ken Ofori-Atta in November this year.

The meetings were part of measures by the Ministry aimed at deepening citizen participation in the budgeting process and to ensure that the nation achieved inclusive growth and national cohesion on its policies and programmes. The engagements afforded stakeholders the opportunity to make submissions into the 2023 budget.

The engagements were attended by representatives from SEND Ghana, Association of Ghana Industries, Makola Women Association, Institute of Statistical, Social and Economic Research (ISSER) of the University of Ghana, Ghana Charismatic and Pentecostal Churches Association and several other civil society organizations, trade groups, academia who made inputs into the 2023 budget.

The rest include, the Republic Bank, Price Water House Coopers, the Institute of Economic Affairs, Ghana Stock Exchange, the Ghana National Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Institute of Internal Auditors, Bank of Ghana, ABSA Bank, ARB Apex Bank, Prudential Bank, GCB Bank Ltd, Zenith Bank, Ghana Amalgamated Bank, and the Institute of Chartered Accountants Ghana,

Presentations and inputs centered on proposed revenue options to be considered by government, reforms on social protection programmes, how government could reduce waste in the public sector, security, education, digitalization and several others.


































EUROPEAN UNION ALLOCATES EUR 10 MILLION TO GHANA'S FOOD SECURITY IN THE CONTEXT OF GLOBAL FOOD CRISIS

The European Union (EU) has pledged an additional EUR 10 million to Ghana to support the most vulnerable populations facing an escalating global food security crisis exacerbated by the war in Ukraine.

This was announced by the Deputy Head of the European Union Mission to Ghana, Mr. Pieter Smidt Van Gelder at the Ministry of Finance.

He said "These new funds will support families to grow crops, generate income and improve food availability on local markets. The EU support will also make Ghanaian farmers more resilient to crisis, by promoting sustainable food production and strengthening integration into national and regional food value chains."


